

MAP

Travel south on Peger Road 3/4 of one mile from the Peger and Van Horn intersection. Then turn left off Peger Road at plant just before you reach the levy at the Tanana River.



FAQ

Q: Does it Smell?

A: Yes. Compost has a mild woody smell similar to topsoil.

Q: Is it Safe?

A: Yes. As a matter of fact, nearly half of the biosolids production in the US is currently used beneficially to improve soil according to the EPA.

Q: Is it ever too late in the season to add compost to my yard or garden?

A: No. By incorporating compost at the end of the season, you'll have rich nutrient dense soil ready for planting this upcoming spring.

What is Compost?

Compost is a product of wastewater biosolids that's been biologically decomposed and stabilized under controlled conditions to a state in which it can be safely handled, stored and applied to land.



Benefits Of Using Compost

Compost creates a better plant root environment by improving soil structure and porosity, and reduces soil density to resist compaction. It has a high quantity of organic matter, which is essential for a healthy soil biota, and improves and stabilizes soil pH.

Compost supplies a variety of macro and micronutrients such as Nitrogen, Phosphorous, Potassium, Calcium, Magnesium, and Iron. It improves cation exchange capacity of soils and growing media, thus improving their ability to hold nutrients for plant use. Beneficial microorganisms are supplied to the soil and other growing media. Erosion and runoff are reduced because compost increases infiltration and permeability of heavy soils.
